Dear Kings River East GSA,

In light of DWR's recent Determinations finding plans incomplete, we would like to offer our support to the GSA for the preparation of a Domestic Well Mitigation Program to protect the drinking water needs of beneficial users in the basin. The Department of Water Resources (DWR) Determination letter released at the beginning of this year instructed the GSA to consider the "current beneficial uses and users of groundwater and the potential effects of the proposed management."¹ KRE GSA must, in sum, prevent impacts to domestic wells that would impair drinking water access unless the GSA can justify that impairment of access to drinking water resulting from GSA management decisions is not "significant and unreasonable." DWR leadership has indicated that justifying the planned loss of drinking water access is a "very high mountain to climb."² Instead, DWR has instructed GSAs to refer to the Domestic Well Impact Mitigation Framework³ during active GSP revisions in order to make sure that drinking water is adequately protected.

According to an independent analysis, King River East's current plan would allow up to 78% of domestic wells in the basin to lose reliable access to drinking water.⁴ Given every Californian has the Human Right to safe and clean drinking water, it is not appropriate for GSPs to allow for drinking water wells to fail without an adequate plan to remedy those failed drinking water wells. Failing to include a plan to remedy failed drinking water wells is inconsistent with local agencies' responsibility to consider all Domestic Well owners, and subsequently, their Human Right to safe and clean drinking water.

As a result of these issues, DWR has stated that within the Kings Subbasin, "the GSAs should assess other factors that may affect where, in their Subbasin, uses and users can or cannot adapt to declining groundwater conditions and then set limits on that decline that prevent significant and unreasonable effects. For example, if the GSAs anticipate groundwater level declines to impact a community's drinking water supply and the community does not have the

economic means to drill a deeper well, then the GSPs should, at a minimum, disclose that fact and, ideally, should adjust their management criteria to avoid that condition or describe projects or management actions the GSAs would take to address the lack of funding or other ways to avoid the impact to the community's drinking water supply."⁵

Community Water Center would like to offer further support to KRE GSA in designing a mitigation program which includes representative monitoring, triggers for preventative action, and a plan for replacement water should it be necessary. In addition, we would like to remind the GSA of the following resources which may be helpful.

RESOLUTION NO. 2022-0701**RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE REVISED KINGS RIVER EAST GROUNDWATER SUSTAINABILITY AGENCY GROUNDWATER SUSTAINABILITY PLAN**

A. **WHEREAS**, in August 2014, the California Legislature passed, and in September 2014 the Governor signed, legislation creating the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act (“SGMA”) “to provide local groundwater sustainability agencies with the authority and technical and financial assistance necessary to sustainably manage groundwater” (Wat. Code, § 10720, (d)); and

B. **WHEREAS**, SGMA requires sustainable management through the development of groundwater sustainability plans (“GSPs”), which can be a single plan developed by one or more groundwater sustainability agencies (“GSAs”) or multiple coordinated plans within a basin or subbasin (Wat. Code, § 10727); and

C. **WHEREAS**, SGMA requires a GSP to be developed and implemented to manage groundwater in all basins designated by the Department of Water Resources (“DWR”) as medium or high priority, including the Kings Subbasin (basin number 5-22.08); and

D. **WHEREAS**, the Kings River East Groundwater Sustainability Agency (“KREGSA”) is a special act district that was formed to be an exclusive GSA for a portion of the Kings Subbasin; and

E. **WHEREAS**, the KREGSA is governed by a seven-member Board of Directors consisting of the following five representing agencies: Fresno County, Tulare County, the City of Reedley, Alta Irrigation District, a representative from a drinking water district, a representative from an irrigation/water district, and a representative for production agriculture; and

F. **WHEREAS**, the KREGSA has the authority to draft, adopt, amend, and implement a GSP (Wat. Code, § 10725 *et seq.*; § 10728.4); and

G. **WHEREAS**, the KREGSA and six other GSAs in the Kings Subbasin each prepared separate GSPs for other regions of the Kings Subbasin for a total of seven GSPs covering the entire Kings Subbasin; and

H. **WHEREAS**, all seven GSAs entered into a Coordination Agreement effective December 20, 2019 (the “Coordination Agreement”) to provide the appropriate coordinated methodologies to allow for the multiple GSPs to successfully manage the Kings Subbasin in a manner compliant with the SGMA. The Coordination Agreement also established a Coordination Workgroup composed of representatives from each Kings Subbasin GSA, outlined information sharing obligations, procedures for resolving conflicts, and designated a Point of Contact for the Kings Subbasin; and

I. **WHEREAS**, the KREGSA developed the Kings River East Groundwater Sustainability Agency Groundwater Sustainability Plan (the “KREGSA GSP”), which was

adopted by the KREGSA after a public hearing on December 13, 2019 and 90-day notification to the affected city and counties; and

J. **WHEREAS**, the Point of Contact submitted the KREGSA GSP and the Coordination Agreement to DWR on January 28, 2020; and

K. **WHEREAS**, on January 28, 2022, DWR completed its review of all the GSPs in the Kings Subbasin and released a letter determining that the GSPs for the Kings Subbasin as a whole were "Incomplete" and identified deficiencies and corrective actions for the GSAs in the Kings Subbasin to take. Amended or modified GSPs addressing the corrective actions from each GSA must be submitted to DWR by July 27, 2022; and

L. **WHEREAS**, the KREGSA has, in coordination with the other GSAs in the Kings Subbasin, developed the draft revised KREGSA GSP ("Revised KREGSA GSP") in order to address the deficiencies and to effect the corrective actions identified by DWR.

The Board of Directors of the KREGSA hereby approves and adopts the final draft Revised KREGSA GSP, dated _____, 2022, in substantially the form presented, subject to such modifications as the executing officer shall approve, said execution to provide conclusive proof of approval of any such modifications.
3. The KREGSA authorizes the Point of Contact and the Plan Manager to take such other actions as may be reasonably necessary to submit the Revised KREGSA GSP to DWR by July 27, 2022, and implement the purpose of this Resolution.
